LOCATION AND TRANSFERS

Robinson School of Music is situated half an hour from the capital's two international airports, Don Mueang (DMK) and Suvarnabhumi (BKK). With its central location in the Sukhumvit area of Bangkok at Soi Sawasdee, it can be accessed from Soi 31 or Soi 23 and the closest stations (Phrom Phong BTS and Sukhumvit MRT) are both a 15-minute walk or a 5-minute drive away. Parking is available at the back of the school.

British pianist, Artistic Director & Founder of PIANO WEEK, Samantha Ward, has performed extensively around the UK and abroad, appearing on British television and radio several times. She made her Wigmore Hall debut in 2007 and has won numerous competitions and awards in the UK, performing in major venues such as St. Martin-in-the-Fields. St. John's Smith Square, Cardiff's St. David's Hall and Manchester Bridgewater Hall.

Samantha launched PIANO WEEK in 2013 and over the last three years she has performed major works for two pianos with world-renowned pianist Stephen Kovacevich as part of the festival. Samantha is a recording artist for Schott Music publishers and the author of the recently published 'Relax with...' series of anthologies.
